The above case is set for oral argument on January 26, 2023, as the 1<sup>st</sup> case.

Oral argument will be held in the courtroom of Town Center East – Building 3, located at 243 Israel Road SE in Tumwater. Cases 1 and 2 will be heard in the morning, with Court convening at 9:00 a.m. Case 3 will be heard in the afternoon with Court convening at 1:30 p.m.

Counsel who are participating in oral argument should report to the bailiff prior to 8:30 a.m. for morning oral arguments and at 1:00 p.m. for afternoon oral argument.

Please also let us know which counsel will be presenting oral argument when you acknowledge receipt of this setting letter by e-mail.

Oral argument will be <u>twenty minutes</u> per side. If a party wishes to request <u>thirty minutes</u> per side for oral argument, the request must be submitted in writing. The Court strongly encourages that, whenever possible, oral argument should be presented by only one-or at most two-counsel per side.

If counsel are aware of any potential amicus curiae, they should be advised RAP 10.2(f)(1) provides that amicus curiae motions and briefs must be served and received by the Court not later than 45 days <u>before</u> oral argument. (If that date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the motion and brief must be received by the preceding day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday.)

Opinions are usually released at 8:00 a.m. on Thursdays. On Wednesdays, a notice will be posted on the court's homepage, **http://www.courts.wa.gov/**, of those opinions that <u>may</u> be released the next morning. *E-mail notification of opinion releases is also available by signing up at the court's web site*. Once the opinion in this case is released, counsel for both parties will be notified by e-mail and a scanned copy of the opinion will be sent as an attachment to e-mail the same day.
